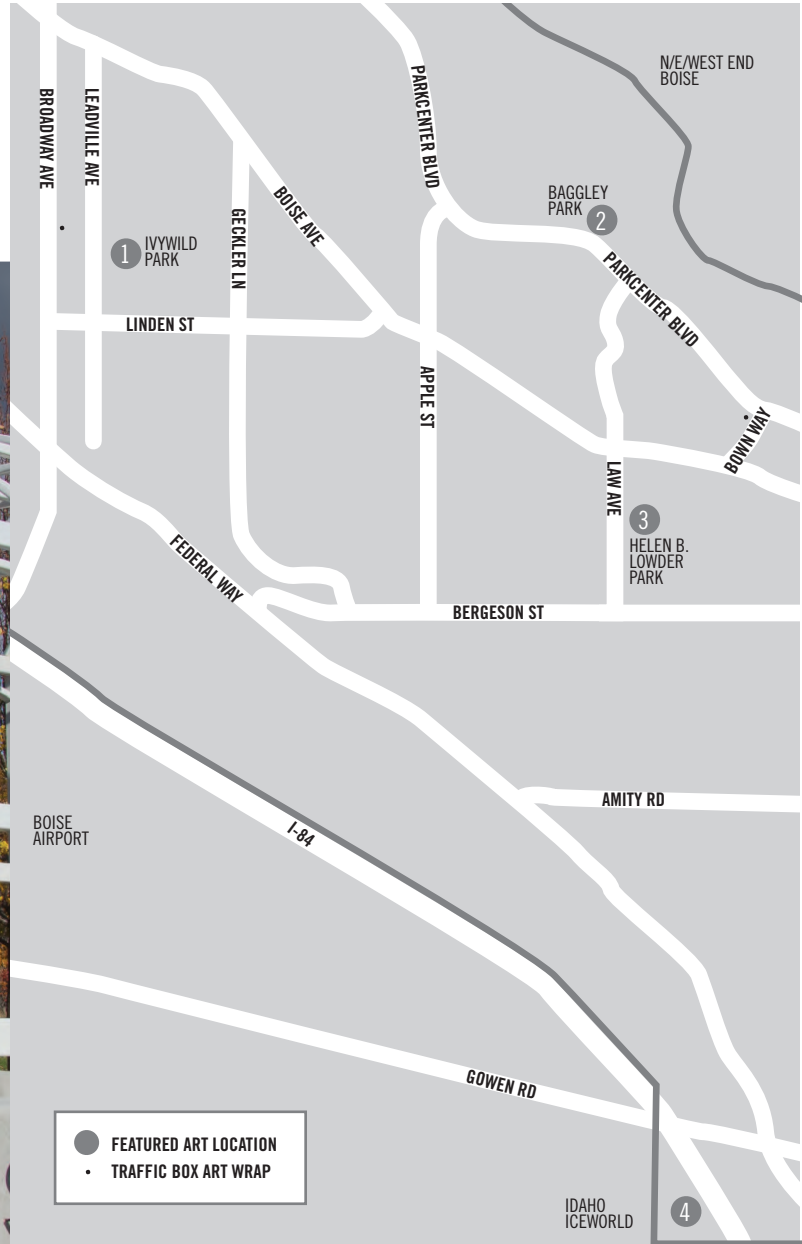

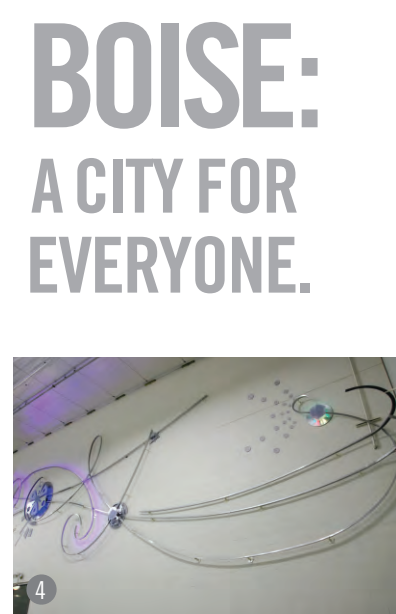
4 Razor Sharp and Fast
